Directions to Camp Bob White –

From Highway 50 - Take the MO-23 exit (toward US-50Bus/Knob Noster/Whiteman AFB /Concordia). Go south on MO-23 about 2 miles to Hwy DD and turn right. Go about 2 miles and then turn left on Shawnee Campground Road. Follow this road and signs to Camp Bob White.

From Warrensburg – Go east on Hwy DD on south edge of Warrensburg for about 6.3 miles. Turn right on Shawnee Campground Road and proceed to Camp Bob White.

Safety Guidelines –

We will be following safety guidelines from the Community of Christ and the Knob Noster State Park. Please be aware that you will need to follow these guidelines.

- Before attending, self-monitor health and try to avoid activities with a high risk for Covid exposure for a week.
- Do not attend if ...
 - You are not feeling well.
 - You have been diagnosed with COVID-19 in the last 14 days.
 - You have been in contact with someone who was exposed to or infected with COVID-19 in the last 14 days. (Not applicable to health care workers or professionals)
 - You have a household member currently on a watch list for COVID-19 exposure.
- Temperatures will be checked at arrival.
- Masks will be worn outdoors when not physically distanced from those outside of your immediate family group (over age 2). Masks may be removed when physical distancing is maintained while outside.
- Masks will be worn indoors except when eating.
- Family groups will need to maintain physical distancing from others while eating lunch and when seated for worships or classes.
- Hand sanitizer will be available at various locations and must be used when entering the dining lodge for lunch.
- Observe limits on the number of people in a restroom at a time.
- No singing.
